ANDREW ROBERTS' BOOK 'HOLY HABITS'

Throughout January and February Andrew will have copies of his book for sale at services he is conducting at Trinity.

Holy Habits explores the nature of Christian discipleship through a rich mix of biblical material and inspiring stories. The nurturing role of ten holy habits of discipleship as seen in Acts 2.42-47 is then explored. The ten habits are: biblical teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread, prayer, giving, service, eating together, gladness and generosity, worship and making more disciples. Each chapter has suggestions for further reflection and action.
