We have just received the six monthly letter from the Well, showing that the total weight of our donations between January - June 2019, from Trinity, was 426.4 KG. Below are segments from the letter for your information:

We are deeply grateful for the support you have given us during this time, and want you to know that you are a part of a lifesaving project. Two of many emails we have received in recent months are a reminder of the reality of food poverty in our communities.

"For the first time in a very long time I've found myself unable to afford any food for 9 days, and am in a desperate situation and would be extremely grateful if I was able to obtain a food parcel?"

"I lost my job last year working due to having fibromyalgia, chronic fatigue and having surgery. Since then I have been struggling to pay bills and buy food. Please could you help?"

As you may know, we always signpost those who contact us direct to support agencies so that their need for a food parcel can be assessed and other support offered. We are now able to give out frozen foods donated by wholesalers/ supermarkets, which means we can give out ready meals for those with limited cooking facilities such as a microwave.

As we write the team are getting ready for the busy Harvest and Christmas seasons which provide us with vital supplies for many months. We do hope that you are able to support us during this time. As you have poured out love in practical generosity, may you know the deep love of Christ who first loved you.
